Please note: There is a limit to the help our volunteers can provide at sessions. You will be able to collect batteries from the following locations
on production of your white book:

St Margaret's Hospital, Audiology Reception
Princess Alexandra Hospital Trust – Eye Reception & Main Entrance (League of Friends)
Herts and Essex Hospital – Outpatients Reception
Ongar War Memorial Medical Centre
Much Hadham Health Centre

You can also send the department a small jiffy bag/padded envelope with a large letter stamp attached and we can post batteries to you. Please send these to St. Margaret's.

Please contact the team at St. Margaret's on 01279 827126 to arrange an appointment. Hearing aids can also be left at or posted to all three sites for repair and they will contact you when they are ready, though this may take up to a week. They can be returned to you by post or collected from the hospital. Please make sure you leave your name, address and date of birth when leaving your aid.

Unfortunately, a drop-in service is not available and the hospital ask you kindly not to bring hearing aids to the team expecting to have them repaired while you wait.
